who we are

The Athens Nurses Clinic (ANC) provides medical, general health, and dental care to indigent, uninsured residents of Clarke County and Northeast Georgia, at no cost to the patient. ANC has been providing this service for over thirty (30) years.

our history

1988

ANC began as the Georgia Nurses Association Foundation Clinic for the Homeless in Athens, treating homeless, indigent patients in the basement of Oconee Methodist Church.

1993

ANC moved to Reese Street as the Athens Nurses Clinic. Open three days a week, the clinic expanded to see all indigent, uninsured patients.

2016

ANC moved to the newly-built Resource Center for Hope (ARCH) on North Avenue.

did you know?

ANC does not discriminate based on race, religion, or gender.



Our dedicated nurse practitioners, nurses, and care coordinators, strengthened by volunteers, volunteer physicians, dentists, pharmacists, nurses, patient educators, care managers, and student interns provide essential health and dental care to our uninsured neighbors in need.

Services include primary care, acute-care “walk-in,” dental treatments, laboratory testing, medications, disease management education, Women’s Health Services including mammograms (thanks to It’s the Journey), and a Hepatitis C Treatment Program, **all at no cost to the patient.**

Our volunteer dentists and dental hygiene students provide needed dental care for our patients.



Most patients are seen for primary medicine: high blood pressure, diabetes, high cholesterol, asthma, and arthritis.

ANC provides testing for patients entering shelters, treatment, and drug court programs.




